



Dress Code

Monday: Spirit Wear Day - Students will be able to wear their Catholic Schools Week t-shirt or Spirit Wear with uniform pants or skirts. Students may wear their regular uniform.

Tuesday: Pajama Bottom Day - Students in grades PreK-5 will be able to wear their pajama bottoms or flannel pants to school. Tops must have short or long sleeves and not made of see-through material. Spirit Wear or uniform tops are preferred. Middle School students will be attending Mass in Ashland with Bishop Christiansen. They are expected to dress up. Jeans are not acceptable. All students may choose to wear their uniform.

Wednesday: Dress-Up Day – Students will be able to wear their uniforms or may dress up for Mass and lunch with the priests and deacons. Jeans are not acceptable.

Thursday: Jersey Day – Students will be able to wear their favorite team jersey (no hats) with their regular uniform pants or skirts. Shoulders must be covered, so basketball jerseys may need to be worn over another shirt. Uniforms may also be worn.

Friday: Non-Uniform Day – Students will be able to wear jeans this day along with a shirt or top of their classroom color. The classroom color shirts and tops should be solid colors with no writing, pictures, or other advertisement printed. Grades are assigned colors as follows:

Preschool - yellow	4 th grade - green
Kindergarten - purple	5 th grade - green
1 st Grade - purple	6 th grade - blue
2 nd Grade - orange	7 th grade - red
3 rd Grade - orange	8 th grade - red

Every day the uniform shoe policy is in effect. This means that sandals, open toed shoes, and fashion boots cannot be worn to school. Students who choose to “push the envelope” on the Catholic Schools Week dress code will have to find a uniform from the parent room to wear for the remainder of the day.
